

Report of the Parish Council Meeting – April 2024

he Parish Council hopes everyone had an enjoyable Easter. Thanks to the Oakley Community Association for a great fun, if soggy, Easter egg hunt!

The Parish Council has been informed by Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council about two further installments from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) that relates to the development at Station Road. £125,730.83 is due to be paid shortly, and £125,730.82 due in October. The Parish Council will be reaching out to the community to listen to your ideas, but please get in touch if you have any thoughts. There is a set of criteria on how CIL money can be used which can be read in the 'Community Infrastructure Levy. A Guide for Parish and Town Council': basingstoke.gov.uk/content/ doclib/4157.pdf or contact the Clerk for a print out.

One area where CIL money can be spent is to enhance play areas and the Parish Council is currently gathering quotes to install a metal football goal in Avon Road play park and a spinning bowl in Beach Park. The hope is installation will start in May. Research is also under way to improve the BMX track.

On 18 May there will be a family fun nature trail taking place to mark the 30th anniversary of local walks that were awarded 1st prize by the Hampshire Wildlife Trust. Come and join us from 10 am at the pond where there will be family activities, refreshments, and guided walks.



Highways Information

Additional road repairs funded by HS2

The Government's cancellation of HS2 resulted in local councils being given additional funding to bring forward



road repairs in this financial year and in each of the next 11 years.

Hampshire was awarded £4.22 million last year and this which has meant we are able to bring forward additional road improvement schemes into this year's programme.

Changes Coming to Hampshire County Council Offices

Hampshire County Council is set to review proposals this week aimed at reducing office accommodation across the county. This move is all about consolidating staff into fewer buildings and saving those precious pennies on running costs.

What's the plan? The strategy will roll out over the coming years, focusing on adapting to changing work patterns and making sure the council's facilities are up to snuff. With many staff working remotely or directly in the community (think local services like social care for our vulnerable neighbours), it's clear that the way we work is evolving.

This isn't just about cutting costs. It's about ensuring access to public services remains robust for everyone in Hampshire. From libraries to register offices, no public service closures are on the table—just smarter use of the space we have.

This is all about staying efficient, effective, and, most importantly, close to the community's heart. While some staff might see changes in their work locations, the goal is to keep everything running smoothly without a hitch to services or the public.

News for Hampshire Bus Travellers

Thanks to a £4.2 million boost from the Government's Bus Service Improvement Partnership, our local bus operators Stagecoach South, Go South Coast, and First Solent are supercharging their services.

What's New?

Enhanced Services: 15 Hampshire bus routes are set to enjoy more day and evening services.

This funding magic stems from Hampshire's £7.2 million slice of the DfT's Bus Service Improvement Plan Plus treasure. It's our ticket not just to saving existing routes from cuts but also adding more frequent services across the board.

From May onwards by Stagecoach:

- Buses between Newbury, Kingsclere and Basingstoke will run later into the evening and on Sundays for the first time, as well as more frequently at weekday peak times. These changes are in partnership with West Berkshire Council.
- Service 76 between Andover, Whitchurch and Basingstoke will improve to every 30 minutes, Monday to Saturday daytime.

These changes will be delivered alongside other planned commercial improvements to

Stagecoach bus services across Hampshire over the coming months.





Hampshire, of which 80 members are under the age
of 18. Kites were first introduced at Malshanger in
2006.


They nest between March/April and usually have up to three eggs; they like to line the next with sheep's wool or perhaps a tea towel or other material that they find lying around. They start breeding at two and half years old and can live till they are 29 years old. They will steal food from other birds, but they prefer to eat roadkill; during late summer tractors working the fields will disturb food for them. Kites will not attack a dog, lamb or small child.

The last known pair to have mated in Hampshire was 1856 before becoming extinct. 1989 was the start of birds being re-introduced from Spain and Germany in the Chilterns and now we have a very healthy population thriving in Hampshire.

On 20 May we will welcome a talk from 'Home

PPG Newsletter May 2024 Health Kiosk

A health kiosk has been installed at Overton Surgery. All patients with a current registration at Watership Down Health are welcome to use it. The Health Kiosk is available from 8 am to 6:20 pm (to allow the checks and information to be transferred into the clinic system) and is situated in the waiting room.

The health kiosk will record a range of information including height, weight and blood pressure as well as a number of health questionnaires being included. The health kiosk transfers any data directly into our clinical system so there is no need to hand in print outs of BPs, etc as the data securely comes into our clinical system. If any queries, please message us via our website. We are grateful to the Friends of Watership Down Health for their support with the funding of the health kiosk.

FeNO (fractional exhaled nitric oxide) & Asthma

WDH is very lucky to be able to offer FeNO testing for patients who may have asthma. FeNO stands for Fractional expired Nitric oxide. Nitric oxide is produced in the lungs when they are exposed to something that triggers an allergic reaction, such as pollens, house dust mite, etc. This will only happen in patients who are susceptible. The trigger causes inflammation in the lungs which, in turn, produces an excess of Nitric oxide.

Your clinician will decide whether a FeNO test would be appropriate. FeNO testing is not suitable for everyone. The test can be affected by caffeine, vigorous exercise, smoking and green leafy vegetables. You will be advised to avoid these things for up to four hours before the test.

If you have been given an inhaler, you should not be using this on the day of the test. If you have had a chest infection which required antibiotics or have taken steroids in the last four weeks you would not be able to have this test as the results would be inaccurate for diagnosis.

Andover minor injuries clinic

Opening hours

Appointments: 8:15 am – 6 pm Monday to Friday

Walk-in service: 8:15 am – 4 pm Monday to Friday (inc. bank holidays)

The Andover minor injuries clinic offers a walk-in service. However patients are strongly advised to call 111 to arrange an appointment, as appointments take priority over walk-ins. This will reduce the likelihood of long wait periods. The clinic is run by a range of expert staff that can now see more patients that need same-day medical care, if this is the right area for your care. Andover minor injuries clinic does not treat illnesses and ailments - please contact 111 or your GP

Treatment at the clinic includes:

- treating minor head injuries, facial and eye injuries, foreign body removal, fractures, bites,
 - minor burns, wound assessment and closure.

There is an X-ray facility on site (if required) Monday to Friday from 9 am to 5 pm, excluding bank holidays.

Members of the public who access NHS 111 may also be directed to their local pharmacist or GP.

Outside clinic opening times, you can continue to access care and advice via NHS 111 online and – in an emergency – by calling 999.

Urgent and emergency cases will continue to be directed to the emergency department (A&E) in either Basingstoke or Winchester.

Mental health and wellbeing

e are finally out of winter and the longer summer days are ahead. However, for some people, the seasons do not stop the challenges that anxiety brings with it.

Alleviating anxiety can sometimes feel as difficult as living with the anxiety. You may have seen the article in a recent Link issue about the wonderful work carried out by Andover Mind and this is just one resource at your fingertips.

I am a Mental Health First Aider (MHFA) and attended the talk at St Leonard's a couple of years ago where some of our local residents openly shared their struggles and challenges, and I would love to be able to help the residents of Oakley as best I can.

Breathing techniques can work wonders alongside visualisation to calm you in the moment. You can try inhaling through your nose for four seconds, holding for four seconds and exhaling through your mouth for eight seconds (while looking at a flickering candle flame can also help). This technique focuses your mind on the counting (and the candle) so it's hard to think about anything else!

Alternatively, you may prefer box breathing. I like to visualise a square as I do this. Counting to four,

inhale through your nose, drawing an imaginary horizontal line from left to right. Continue by exhaling for four and imagine the line continuing down. Inhale again for four, mentally drawing the line from right to left; then finish by exhaling for four and picturing the line going up to meet the start point.

Mental Health First Aiders are not just here to help

with anxiety. I can support with other conditions such as depression or suicidal thoughts. If you are interested in learning more about anxiety-aid techniques, or how I can support you as a MHFA, please contact me at lauren@companion-health.com.

I am fascinated by first names, what they mean and why they were chosen. A favourite name or a special meaning? Maybe a family name passed down through the generations. Oakley Woodlands Group

The end of the season! The volunteers of the Oakley Woodlands Group have hung up their tools for the summer after giving over 800 volunteer hours to maintaining Cowdown and St

John's copse. We almost managed to complete our target. The area in Cowdown was finished, but time ran out in St John's and one small area near the railway line escaped the axe.

We stop cutting in March as the breeding season gets underway, which lasts through to August. At this time of year the wildlife is especially vulnerable, so



we ask that dog walkers keep their dogs on leads when in the woods during this period.

We finished off our work in April by erecting the temporary fencing to keep deer away from the succulent new shoots sprouting from the coppiced hazel. The fencing in St John's will be especially noticeable this season, being close to the road. We know it is not the prettiest sight in the woods, but it has proven to be necessary and should be taken down after two or three years.

The presence of deer is not just evident from the nibbled shoots, but they star on our trail cam videos which we post on our Facebook page. Recent highlights include a badger snuffling out a worm, a red

kite having lunch and an owl just being an owl. During the summer, the group will, in conjunction with BDBC, plan the work for next winter. This will start again in September, when new volunteers will be welcome. We provide tools, training and biscuits.

Probus Hears About WWII SOE Training at Beaulieu

isitors to the National Motor Museum at Beaulieu in the New Forest may have spotted a building close to Palace House which is a museum about the training that took place in WWII for the SOE.




The Special Operations Executive was the subject of the latest talk at the Probus Club of Basingstoke by speaker Nick Saunders who is a part time archivist at the Royal Hampshire Regiment Museum in Winchester.

The SOE was set up in 1940 on the instructions of Prime Minister Winston Churchill to "Set Europe ablaze" by conducting espionage, sabotage and reconnaissance in German occupied Europe and to aid local resistance movements. While the SOE had its headquarters in Baker Street, London, all training took place around the country.

The organisation generated different unofficial names, *The Baker Street Irregulars, Churchill's Secret Army, Ministry of Ungentlemanly Warfare* with the most apt *Stately 'omes of England* as many country houses and private estates were requisitioned. Several such large properties existed around the Beaulieu estate and served as training bases specialising in the dark arts of guerilla activities.

Burglary, silent killing, parachute skills, radios, morse code and weapons training were the main



courses. It was imperative that their agents had a good knowledge of a particular country and that their language skills were sufficient to pass as a native. Although 13,000 agents underwent training, which included 3,000 at the Beaulieu Finishing School, there were many women who undertook the same training and had volunteered to assume roles in German occupied countries.

The Germans knew about what was happening at Beaulieu and named it *The Gangster School*. Among the 175 staff at Beaulieu were Guy Burgess and Kim Philby, who later absconded to Russia; they taught mind games to undermine German morale.

The agents dropped into occupied countries should not be compared to the fictional TV series 'Allo 'Allo! as many were captured, tortured and executed.




