We are raising awareness of the risks of skin cancer and ways you can help to reduce your risk. 86% of cases of melanoma are preventable yet increasing numbers of people are being diagnosed with this type of skin cancer. There are now more than 16,000 new cases each year in the UK. Being sun -safe and regularly checking your skin for any changes, are two really important ways you can reduce your skin cancer risk.

Facts about Skin Cancer:

Melanoma skin cancer is the 5th most common cancer in the UK, accounting for 5% of all new cancer cases (2017-2019). 1 in 36 men and 1 in 47 women will be diagnosed with skin cancer in their lifetime

There are two types of skin cancers: melanoma and non-melanoma:

Non-melanoma refers to skin cancers which develop in the upper layer of your skin (the epidermis). You can be diagnosed with basal cell carcinoma (BCC), most non-melanoma diagnoses are BCC, or squamous cell carcinoma (SCC). Both these types of skin cancers don't spread to other parts of your body. Non-melanoma cancers usually develop in areas which are most exposed to the sun such as your face, ears, hands, shoulders, upper chest and back. Melanoma can spread to other parts of your body which is why it's the more serious type of skin cancer.

Overexposure to the sun or sunbeds are the main cause of all skin cancers. More than 1 in 4 skin cancer cases are diagnosed in people under 50, which is early compared with most other types of cancer.

Brown or black skin is more susceptible to a type of melanoma that is not associated with sun exposure, but appears on the palms, soles, under the nails and in mucosal membranes such as the mouth. These areas

should be regularly checked for people with this skin type. (source: British Skin Foundation) **Risk factors:**

- a previous non-melanoma skin cancer.
- a family history of skin cancer.
- pale skin that burns easily.
- a large number of moles or freckles.
- taking medicine that suppresses your immune system.

• a co-existing medical condition that suppresses your immune system.

You can minimise your risk of developing skin cancer by practising sun safety:

- use high factor sunscreen.
- dress sensibly in the sun.

• limit the amount of time you spend in the sun during the hottest part of the day (11 am to 3 pm).

• avoid sunbeds and sunlamps.

Regularly checking your skin for signs of skin cancer can help lead to an early diagnosis and increase your chance of successful treatment.

Bee keeping involves a considerable amount of knowledge so Oakley and Deane WI were informed by David Holloway, a Trustee of Basingstoke and Deane and Hampshire Beekeeping Association, at the June meeting. It is fitting for Oakley to learn about bees as the father of beekeeping is the Rev. Charles Butler rector of Wootton in1683. There is a window devoted to him in Wootton Church. Bees existed in 4,000 BC as shown on a cave painting. One pound of honey requires 2 million flowers to be visited. Much of the honey in shops has been bulked up by fructose. David is also a Partnership manager with bees abroad in Uganda.

Members sold some garden produce and names were taken for an outing to Kew Gardens lights in December. The next meeting on Tuesday 8 July will be organised by members who are not on the committee and it will be a surprise.

Damp and mould in rented housing

This month, our advice covers what to do if you're living in a rented property and notice damp or mould. You should check your tenancy agreement and don't hesitate to ask for advice. It's important to report the problem to your landlord or letting agent in writing as soon as possible as they are usually only responsible for repairing the problem when they become aware of it. Your landlord shouldn't blame you for having damp in your home. It's their responsibility to find out what's causing the damp.

There are several types of damp:


- rising damp which happens when moisture travels up from the ground through the masonry to the height of about one metre
- penetrating damp which happens when water penetrates into the fabric of a building from outside to inside, for example, because of a leaking downpipe

- construction damp where damp is caused by a problem in how the property was designed
- condensation damp which generally happens when a property can't deal with normal levels of water vapour because of a lack of insulation, ventilation or heating, or a combination of all of these things.



New nesting tower gives swifts and house martins a lifeline

A specially designed nesting tower has been installed at Blashford Lakes Nature Reserve to support struggling populations of swifts and house martins. It marks Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust's first nesting tower across its estate, and provides much-needed secure nesting sites for these red-listed bird species.

Swifts and house martins have experienced significant population declines in recent decades, due to habitat loss and a reduction in suitable nesting sites. The UK breeding population of swifts have declined by 66 percent between 1995 and 2022, while house martins have declined by 44 per cent.

Standing five metres tall, the tower features 23 swift boxes and 12 house martin cups, offering muchneeded breeding opportunities. It incorporates ventilation to keep the nests cool during warmer months and is equipped with solar panels and speakers to play pre-recorded bird calls, attracting young birds searching for a nesting site to settle into.

"This is the first nest tower of its kind across the Trust's entire estate," said Jack Medley, Reserves Officer at Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust. "It marks a significant milestone in our ongoing efforts to help swifts and house martins, two remarkable species facing serious challenges. The tower is part of our commitment to providing innovative solutions that help these birds thrive."

Swifts and house martins migrate from sub-Saharan Africa to breed in the UK, depending on suitable nesting sites and an abundant insect population. Historically, swifts have nested in the roofs of older buildings, but modern renovations are sealing up access points, leaving them without suitable breeding spaces. The new tower mimics natural nesting conditions, offering a secure, predatorfree location, giving these birds a vital lifeline.

Jack says, "Swifts and house martins are remarkable birds that complete incredible migrations from Africa each year. By providing secure nesting

Lakes Nature Reserve create perfect conditions for insects to flourish, ensuring the birds have the resources they need to thrive during the breeding season.

Bringing this vision to life required a combination of expert knowledge, skilled design, and generous support, as Jack explains, "I'm incredibly proud of this project and would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone who made it a reality. A special thank you goes to Hampshire Ornithological Society

for their generous funding, Hampshire Swifts for their expert advice and guidance and to Peak Boxes for their craftsmanship. This tower represents a huge step in our ongoing conservation efforts to protect these vulnerable species, and we couldn't have achieved it without the support of our partners and the dedication of so many involved."

Located next to the site's largest lake, Ibsley Water, the tower is viewable near Goosander hide. It will be closely monitored, with data collected on nest occupancy each year.

t is the height of summer but not all OWGers have been resting on their laurels (or hazel wands). Instead, they have been getting stuck into surveying the woods, in some cases weekly, to see what impact thirty years of conservation work has had. When

the group first formed in 1997 a number of surveys were carried out to establish a base line. Since then, we have been somewhat remiss in repeating the work, with perhaps the exception of butterflies, where a ten-

year survey was completed.

The recent surveys have been looking at flowers, bats, dormice and butterflies, and are part of a Borough wide initiative. The dormice monitoring is carried



out in conjunction with The Hampshire Dormice

Society as the work has to be led by someone certified to handle dormice as they are a protected species. Bat surveys involve the use of bat detectors which make the ultrasonic sounds the bats make



audible to human ears and can provide a visible trace of the sound waves making it possible to identify the species of bat.

The results of the surveys are logged for local use and via an app iRecord for national use. As well as

> noting the species and quantity, the location is noted. The plant surveys are less technical, requiring just good eyesight and a clipboard. Some of the plants that have been identified are: Lady's Mantle and Common Spotted Orchid. It is hoped that we will be able to compare the new data with the base data. Celebrating Basingstoke and Deane's conservation champions

The time local volunteers have spent carrying out nature conservation work to protect and enhance the borough's natural environment has grown by more than 2,000 hours in a year. Over 12,000 hours were given by nature conservation groups from April 2024 to April 2025 to support Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's pledge to help nature recover and tackle the ecological emergency, up from 9,874 hours in the same period last year.

To thank the 251 volunteers responsible for this tremendous effort, a garden party with food and live music was held on Friday (13 June) at the Walled Garden in Basingstoke. Cabinet Member for Climate and Ecological Emergency Cllr Chris Tomblin joined the celebrations to show his gratitude to them and the 18 nature groups they belong to.

These groups, who are supported by the council and Natural Basingstoke, help to restore and manage green spaces owned by the council to benefit wildlife and local communities. Their work supports the council's rangers, who manage over 300 hectares of green space in the borough, along with its biodiversity, tree and grounds maintenance teams.

Great crested newt populations have suffered rapid decreases in recent decades due to habitat loss but, thanks to the Popley and Marnel Conservation Group's ongoing efforts to care for Popley Ponds, numbers are now on the up, helping to reverse the decline of this rare amphibian. Other recent successes include the careful management of woodland and scrub at Sherfield Park by the Sherfield Park Conservation Group to help reptiles, birds and insects thrive. Biodiverse lowland heath habitats are being restored in Tadley, thanks to the efforts of The Friends of Wigmore Heath group and the council's rangers.

And last autumn, nature volunteers from 10 different conservation groups including in

restore the very rare and fragile wildlife-rich grass

chalklands that were once common in the southern

Cllr Chris Tomblin said: "The 12,052 hours our volunteers have committed to nature conservation efforts over the past year is nothing short of extraordinary. It's an increase of over 2,000 hours compared to the same period last year and equivalent to someone working with no breaks for 24 hours a day, seven days a week, for more than a year.

"Working with our communities to reverse the decline of nature in the borough is a core part of our biodiversity strategy and I am so grateful to each and every person who has given their time and expertise to help us protect our natural environment. We are making great progress together but there is always more to do and the conservation groups are always looking for more people to join them. There are so many benefits, including getting exercise, being outdoors in the fresh air and making new friends, and so I encourage everyone to think about whether they could get involved too."

Growing the diversity of native plants and wildlife on its land and working together with communities to enhance and create habitats were two of the priority actions the council set for itself when it adopted its biodiversity strategy in March last year.


